ELIGIBILITY

Our UK Student Summer Schools are always oversubscribed so we strongly encourage you to read the information below carefully. Our programmes are open to applicants who:

- Are currently in Year 12 in England or Wales, Year 13 in Northern Ireland, or S5 in Scotland
- Are attending a state-funded secondary school/college (non-fee paying) in the UK
- Have achieved at least five A or A* grades at GCSE, or five A or B passes at National 5, and, where applicable, are taking subjects relevant to the subject stream applied for

You must meet the qualifying measures above for your application to be considered unless there are any extenuating circumstances which must be declared on the application form.

In addition, we are looking for applicants who meet the criteria below. The more of these you meet, the more likely you are to secure a place.

- Are first generation of your family to attend university
- Have been eligible for one or more of free school meals, Pupil Premium, EMA and/or 16-19 bursary during secondary school
- Attend a school or college with a below-average A-level or Higher point score and/or a low rate of progression to higher education
- Come from a neighbourhood with a low rate of progression to higher education and/or a high level of socio-economic deprivation

Priority will be given to applicants who are (or have been) looked after, accommodated or in care.

Your application will be assessed by the university you apply to and in some cases they will use additional selection criteria.

You can apply to both the UK and US Summer Schools but can take part in only one programme. Students can apply to only one UK Summer School. Applications to more than one UK Summer School will not be considered.

INFORMATION FOR TEACHERS

Every student application must be verified by a teacher via the online application system. Applicants will be asked to nominate a teacher at their school to provide this verification when filling in their form, and that teacher will receive an e-mail containing instructions on the verification process.

Teachers will be able to review their assigned student's application to confirm that the information submitted is accurate and complete. There is also space for teachers to add any extenuating circumstances that should be taken into account when a university reviews the application.

Teachers should verify all applications by 5pm on Thursday, 9th March 2017.
